# ... an essay on the portrayal of language acquisition in Lina Rodriguez' "Mis dos voces"

Immigrants are often falsely accused of "not wanting" to learn their new country's language. However, language acquisition is an incredibly difficult task for adult immigrants, who are not able to take advantage of a structured curriculum, and have to learn in unfamiliar, sometimes hostile environments. Lina Rodriguez thematizes these issues in her Film "Mis dos voces".

Are you dedicated to promoting young talents and passing on your academic knowledge and personal experience? This is your chance - apply now for the Next Generation Literacies mentoring program! All network members are warmly invited to apply as a mentor (i.e., postdoctoral researchers, junior, and senior professors) and/or as a mentee (i.e., doctoral and postdoctoral researchers, and junior professors).

The mentoring program can be shaped according to the mentees and mentors needs - duration, frequency and structuring is agreed on in every tandem individually and dependents on their specific mentoring goals. Additionally, we offer workshops on mentoring (first workshop in the summer) and organizational support.

## **Support - Network Funding**

Our network provides budget for emergent researchers (PhDs, PostDocs, Junior Profs) to support research activities promptly. What is funded: Funding includes conference fees, travel costs, technical support/special software, short-term working contract for study assistants, translation costs and publishing fees (e.g., open access).

Who can apply: Every emergent researcher who is a network member can apply for funds.

How to apply: To apply for funds, please fill in this form and send it to Katharina. Ackermann@uni-hamburg.de.

Assessment of applications: Within the executive committee we use a four-eyes principle to assess your application. Application will be considered keeping the following in mind: link to network topic and aim, amount requested, and need of funding. Due to a limited yearly budged, we recommend checking other funding possibilities (e.g., host university, DAAD) before submitting your application.

These visiting scholars will serve as role models in research and teaching. Visiting professorships are open to female professors or researchers with a Habilitation or equivalent (e.g., junior professors, associate professors) from all subject areas from Germany or abroad.
