

# HOWBET – Campus Europae Summer School in Teacher Training & Education Science 2014

## What? Where? When?

“**HOW** to **B**ecome a **E**uropean **T**eacher – Challenges for the Present and the Future” is the title of the first Campus Europae Summer School in Teacher Training and Education, which will take place at the **University of Aveiro (Portugal) from Monday 14<sup>th</sup> to Friday 25<sup>th</sup> of July 2014** with the financial support of the European Union and Campus Europae.

## Which are the partner institutions? How many teachers/students will participate?

There are six Campus Europae partner institutions, which collaborate with the University of Aveiro in the summer school project. These six partner institutions are:

- University of Eastern Finland, Joensuu, Finland
- University of Hamburg, Hamburg, Germany
- Vytautas Magnus University, Kaunas, Lithuania
- University of Łódź, Łódź, Poland
- University of Latvia, Riga, Latvia
- University of Vienna, Vienna, Austria

Each of the six partners is entitled to send five teacher training students and one teacher, which, together with the five students and the host teacher(s) of the University of Aveiro adds up to a total of 35 students and 7 teachers.

## Who can apply? How can I apply?

The CETT summer school's target group are teacher training students who are studying in the first or second cycle. The student selection/application procedure will be held at the local partner institutions. Selection criteria include Campus Europae exchange experience (although not mandatory) and a motivation letter in English. Dates and deadlines for the application are to be announced soon by the partner institutions, while **Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> of March** should be regarded **as a common deadline** for all partner institutions – **please note that internal deadlines may be set earlier by the partner institutions!**

## How much do I have to pay?

A share of the travel costs in the case they exceed a sum of 187€ (for participants from AT or DE) or 262€ (for participants from FI, LV, PL and LT), will have to be paid by the participants. Accommodation and meals will be provided by the programme.

**Will the summer school participation be recognized by my university?**

The summer school course will be recognized as a 4 ECTS course by all partner institutions. Which specific course(s) can be replaced by the summer school participation is up to the partner institutions.

**What are the contents of the programme? How should I prepare myself?**

There will be a combination of lectures and single/group work, and while in the first week there is an input-focus on lectures (although already combined with group work), the second week will have an output-focus on group work.

Furthermore, there will be cultural and social events in the evenings, which will be organized by the students/teachers of the different universities. As the students are co-responsible for the preparation of those events, they are encouraged to bring items, which they consider to be informative or in any other way useful for the preparation of those events.

In addition to that, before and during the programme each student will have to:

1. use the Moodle online platform to **prepare for the programme before it starts** (read basic literature as introduction & preparation)
2. keep and update an e-portfolio on Moodle during the programme, in which texts/essays written by the students during the programme have to be collected
